THE ANTIQUE STEAM AND GAS ENGINE MUSEUM TOUR





LA JOLLA CAR SHOW

There were some nice cars at the show, including a couple of significant Mercedes-Benz. The 230 S and a 1951 170Db





This 230 S / W153 Special Roadster is an off-road rally car. It is powered by a 58hp 2.3 liter in-line 6 with dual carburetors, 4 speed manual transmission, and top speed of 81mph.

It is one of nine built by Mercedes for use by the German Automobile Club in European off-road rally events, such as the Deutsche Alpenfahrt, Ost Preussen Rally and the Brandenburg Rally. Well known race and rally drivers Karl Kling, Hermann Lang and Hans Stuck were assigned to these cars and participated in the rallies. This vehicle was restored by the Mercedes-Benz Classic Center. This model was never sold to the general public but was delivered to the German automobile Club to participate in Government sponsored rallies. Only two of these vehicles have survived, this one and the second is on display at the Mercedes-Benz Museum in Stuttgart, Germany.

The Worsch/Sougias 1951 170Db Story by Bob Gunthorp

This 170Db was originally sold by one of Max Hoffman's dealerships. The first time I saw these 170Db was in February 1968 when I started working at T. Roos German Motors where Walter Worsch was the lead mechanic. The 170Db was Walters's daily transportation. Almost every day for the five years I was working at German Motors Walter drive the 170Db from Carmel Valley the Pacific Beach. When the engine was in need of overhauling Walter decided restore the car even though it was still in remarkable good condition.



For years Walter and Teresa would display the car at The Orange County MBCA section two day exhibition in the Fashion Island shopping center. Every year at the Sunday breakfast representatives from Mercedes-Benz of North America would select the car they would like to take home. One year they selected the 170Db over all of the high-end cars including 300SL Gullwings and roadsters. (Editor ,As I recall Daimler took the car to Germany for display and returned it to Walter)y

When Walter passed away Charlie Sougias of Charlies Foreign in Encinitas purchased the 170D from Teresa. Sadly, Charlie passed

away suddenly last year. His son Niko is the car caretaker. Niko, his mother Shelly, and wife and children displayed the 170 at this year's La Jolla Concours d'Elegance

The General Field Marshall Von Hindenburg Passenger Plane, at the time the world's largest airplane. The aircraft was first assembled in 1931 and continued to be modified until 1934. It was powered by four V-12 diesel engines with 30 passengers seated in the wings facing forward and there were two seats in the nose. It provided an 11-seat smoking lounge. Top speed 140mph and a blazing cruise speed of 109mph. Mechanics were part of the crew as the engines could be serviced or repaired in flight. The diesel engines were water cooled and retractable radiators were deployed under the wing and may be seen under the wing in this photo.

The large ring hanging under the nose of the aircraft is not a mooring attachment but a very critical piece of navigation equipment. This is a Radio Frequency Directional Antenna, probably the first electronic navigation aid for aircraft.

The two sophisticated ladies with the Mercedes-Benz 540 are most likely posing for an advertisement of Lufthansa, Mercedes-Benz or both. Obviously catering to the more '**well to do'** customers.

The Mercedes-Benz is definitely a 500 series. I think this is a 1935 or 36 500K. In today's dollars this car cost over \$109,000.00. This Mercedes-Benz produced 160hp and had an autobahn speed of 99 mph. Almost as fast as the airplane


