Technical Tips and Tricks (TTT)

Radiator Fan Clutch Replacement Gone Wrong!


Most Mercedes indicate a running temperature of 85 degrees Celsius. Last summer I noticed my 93 300CE Cabriolet was running at 90 Degrees Celsius and, having owned five of this model, I was familiar with the problem and knew the radiator fan clutch needed replacement.

The Radiator Fan Clutch, used on most models from the 80's into the 2000 model years, allows the fan to increase in rpm to a point when it will slip to limit the fan speed and provide optimal cooling. These are easy to test. With the engine at idle, insert a rolled-up magazine into the fan blades. If the fan stops turning, the clutch has failed. If you are unable to stop the fan, the clutch is still good. (Caution - don't cut your fingers off)

This is usually one of the easier maintenance tasks, with only one bolt mounting the fan to the engine output shaft.

Removing the radiator cowling, I had good access to the single mounting screw. However, what started as a somewhat simple task turned out to be much more complicated. I noticed the Belt tensioner was frozen and not releasing the belt. The tensioner uses a rubber bushing to maintain belt tension. The rubber bushing had hardened from the heat of the engine and 30 years of aging. Again not a complicated task, by removing three pulleys, the belt, mounting bracket and center bolt holding the tensioner, the tensioner and shock will easily pull straight out. At

this point in the process things got worse, the center bolt was difficult to remove and I found the screw treads damaged. I had to obtain a replacement screw from the dealer.





Removing the bolt also damaged the mounting block treads. Using a thread tap, I reformed the treads by running the tap in three times and used compressed air to clean the threaded hole of debris. Finally, everything worked out and I was able to install the new tensioner and mount the new fan clutch. This was a good time to replace the serpentine belt with a new OE part from Mercedes. Once the job was complete, the car's running temperature was back to normal. Whew! What was supposed to take 2 hours turned into a 2-day job.

I appreciate these somewhat challenging tasks. I am restoring the Cabriolet to show-room condition and the work helps achieve my goal of 100% restored. For this model year, only 700 units were produced for worldwide distribution.



Mercedes-AMG Petronas F-1

With six F-1 races completed in the 2024 season, Mercedes-AMG still finds itself battling gremlins in their W15 cars. With the completion of the Chinese F-1 in which George Russell came in 6th and Lewis Hamilton 9th, our drivers find themselves in 6th (Russell) and 9th (Hamilton) overall. In the Constructors Standings, Mercedes is currently 4th, behind Red Bull, Ferrari, and McLaren. Toto Wolff, Team Principle, still has faith in the team and in Hamilton (primary driver), to get things right. We'll have to see what improvements they bring to Miami.

With Lewis going to Ferraril for the 2025 season, the rumor mill is still working overtime with who will fill his spot. The latest is that Max Verstappen, current F-1 leader who drives for Red Bull, wants over \$260m USD a year to drive for Mercedes, over twice his current salary. Standby for more on that item.

The next two races are: Emilia Romagna (ITA) on May 3, and Monaco (MCO) on May 26. Check your television provider for the exact channel and times.
