Long Sault Parkway Drive

Our second event this year was a drive along the Long Sault Parkway. This event was held on May 29th and



had 26 people participating in 15 cars. The weather once again cooperated and made for a great day.

The Parkway is 11 kilometers long and connects a series of small islands. The area was impacted when

40,000 acres of land was flooded for the construction St. Lawrence Seaway and Hydro program to develop power generating stations near Cornwall in the 1950's. The Parkway is now administered by the St. Lawrence Parks Authority.

We went in convoy from Ingleside to the Woodlands
