A Special Collection

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One of our Ottawa Section members has a collection of some very special MB's. We asked Michael Hoegl to share some info on his cars which we thought would be of interest to Club members. We'd like to thank Michael for sharing the information and photos with us. I'm sure Michael would be happy to talk more about his unique vehicles to be sure and ask him about them when you see him at any of our club events.

1970 Mercedes-Benz 600 LWB

This car started its life in Sault Lake City, UT. The first owner was an industrialist who purchased the car for his own use. After that I do not know who was the second owner, but I bought it off a Japanese corporation which shipped it to Los Angeles, CA to sell. After I purchased the car it was like the never ending story concerning the restoration.

Now the car is finished and it is my intention to sell it. None of the 600 are the same, each one is different, starting with the interior material to the type of wood used and the location of sunroofs if ordered. It took 63 days to built this car and only 486 LWBs were built in the 18 year production run, 59 of them were Landaulets.

1985 Mercedes-Benz 300GD

This car was never sold in Canada and is imported by someone. It initially came with the 3.0L 5Cyl engine which





directly competing with a turtle on the highway. The previous owner swapped the engine out with a 3.0L 5Cyl turbo charged engine from a 300SD. Now I can leave the turtle behind, and only the turtle. Due to the weight of the car it is still underpowered.

1995 Mercedes-Benz SL74

This car started out as a SL600 in Montreal. After I purchased it I realised, that 390 HP is not enough and I contacted Renntech in Florida. The are in the same market as AMG, Brabus etc. They bored the engine to a 7.4 and with doing this the brakes, transmission, exhaust and computer chip were also upgraded. Now there is about 540HP natural aspirated. I enjoy taking it to the track.at StarFest.



1913 Benz W5 8/20HP

This car was built in Mannheim, Germany. As a rolling chassis it was sold into Australia where the body was put on the car. When the previous owner bought the car, it was completely disassembled and put in boxes. He said it took him close to 10 years to put it together. He had to do the restoration mainly from pictures since all the records in Germany were destroyed by air raids. The body of the car is a reproduction which they made going through pictures of a dealership. Unfortunately nobody knows what the original body was. I know of 8 other W5's in existence, most of them in the land down under. The 8 in the name of it indicated the tax horsepower and the 20 the actual engine output horsepower.
