Saturday, Sept 22, 2012 Afternoon Road Trip | Cotton Field Harvest & Gin Tour 1:00pm – 6:00pm

Itinerary: Caravan out to the harvesting field operated by Duane Regier and Ty Miller, and view the process of picking and module packing cotton. Then, travel 70 miles (1 1/2 hours) for a private tour of a cotton gin in Anthony, KS. After the tour, gather nearby for refreshments & drawings.

Option: Arrive early, 12:00pm, and have lunch at the cafe before heading out to the field. Have your vehicle fueled and ready to head out promptly at 1pm.

Note: Everyone should be able to safely ride in the harvesting equipment and see things close up if desired. All the moving equipment is enclosed and one will have to climb 4-5 steps on entrance ladders etc. so dress appropriately (no loose clothing or open shoes). Should be lots of opportunities for photos. Access to the harvest field and gin may be on paved or gravel roads. If needed, vice president Vin Kissick has volunteered to shuttle passengers from a paved area to the field site. Do expect some dust.

Directions: From K-96 at Maize, KS, go west on K-96 for 4 miles, then north on 151st Street for 4 miles.

For the past 10-15 years, Kansas farmers have been planting and harvesting cotton, an alternative to wheat, soybeans, or corn. Cotton is heat and drought tolerant, insurable, and traded on the board of trade; a basic commodity that is as old as time itself. With a new strain that matures in a shorter time, cotton can now be grown as far north as southern region of Kansas.

Modern cotton harvesting is a lot different from the way it was decades ago. Now it is harvested and tightly packed into 30 foot modules that are picked up by trucks and hauled to a gin for thorough cleaning and baling for shipment to cotton mills all over the world.

MY MERCEDES EXPERIENCE by Steven Beskett

I'll tell you my story of how I got bit by the Mercedes-Benz "bug". As some of you may or may not remember, back in the 80's there was a TV show "DALLAS" about a wealthy Texas family in the oil business. One of the main characters, Bobby Ewing, drove a red 560 SL. At the time, I thought that was the most beautiful car I had ever seen. I should mention that I was only ten years old. I didn't know anything about Mercedes-Benz at the time so I read everything I could find about them. I was impressed with the style, engineering, safety features, and the high level of quality.

I had to wait ten years before I could purchase my first Mercedes-Benz, a 1979 450 SEL. Much of my free time was spent waxing and detailing my pride and joy.
