Following the tour the group then headed to Cy's Hoof and Horn restaurant in nearby Sedgwick, KS for a hearty lunch and to swap stories about being in front of the camera.

- Helpful Hint -

If you are interested in the value of a vehicle that is older than 1992, you will need to find resources other than the Kelly Blue **Book**. There are many websites that can help. One useful resource is at **Hagerty.com**; but without a free account, the Hagerty Classic Car Value Guide is limited to only 10 searches. However, to get around the limit, many other well known sites use Hagerty's data and will link to the same Hagerty.com webpages, e.g., Hemmings.com.
