Prepping an R107 for the 2019 Season

The R107 450SL hit the American scene in the early seventies. Around that time domestic two seater machines like the Corvette, Camaro and Mustangs came equipped with powerful V-8 engines.

Mercedes-Benz joined this sporty trend, equipping U.S. delivered SL's with SOHC 4.5 Liter V-8 engines. Now 40 years later and looking back at the elegant lines that produced this classic beauty, the V-8 hidden under the hood still invokes a bit of magic.

As with previous SL models R107's are evolving from daily drivers to weekend cruisers. They are content sitting pretty in the garage for the winter, in the summer logging a thousand miles going to car shows and wine tastings, and some fair weather commuting to work. Cars that sit around so much have a few additional maintenance items to address - mostly to do with gas, brake fluid, engine coolant/corrosion protection and tire pressures.


Gas issues. Like a wine without a cork, gas will go bad in the tank while in storage. Car gas tanks are not airtight. Oxygenation is the culprit and causes gas to convert to varnish and gooey solids! Remember to pour a fuel stabilizer in your gas tank for the winter.

The tank should be close to full in storage mode leaving little room for water to condense on any exposed tank wall. Biggest headaches with a car stored for long periods are fuel related. Wine turns to vinegar, gas turns to varnish! A new ingredient in gas is Ethanol which is very hydroscopic, attracting water from the atmosphere into the gas. Simply adding a product like STA-BIL brand gas treatment as directed fights oxygenation and condensation.

Brake fluid is also naturally hydroscopic, every a couple of years have the old contaminated brake fluid flushed out, especially with cars that are stored.

Any green colored anti-freeze must go! Protect inner engine parts with approved anticorrosion fluid only. If you can't remember when the coolant/antifreeze has been changed in your engine consider this a cheap insurance for the future.

With an extra pound or two of air pressure, tires in storage mode should be all right. Better yet get them off the ground to prevent flat spotting. Rumbling from the flat spot on the tires may be apparent when first driving in the spring. This flat area should disappear within a hundred miles of driving. It is always something with your pampered weekend cruiser!


